Background

Game Theory is a mathematical framework dealing with models of conflict and cooperation among interdependent decision makers or agents. It is a central tool for economics and the social sciences, which poses challenging research questions in mathematics, control, and optimization, and is applied across a wide variety of fields, including neuroscience, philosophy, and biology.

SING7 is the seventh in the series of Spain-Italy-Netherlands Meetings on Game Theory, and the first one organized in France. Focusing on new research directions in Game Theory, the meeting provided a venue for new research collaborations.

Scope

This special volume on Game Theory is not restricted only to presenters at SING7 conference in Paris, but the submission invitation is addressed to all researchers and practitioners from the related disciplines. Topics of interest include – but are not limited to – the following:

Algorithmic Game Theory, Assignment, Auctions, Bankruptcy and Division Problems, Bargaining, Coalition Formation, Cooperative Game Theoretical Models, Cost Sharing, Differential Games, Evolutionary Game Theory, Experiments, Game Practice, Market Games, Matching, Mechanism Design, Multistage and Repeated Games, Non Cooperative Games, Oligopoly Games, OR Games, Signaling, Social and Communication Networks, Social Choice, Voting and Power Indices.

Submission Procedure

All submissions will follow the high standard refereeing process of the *Annals of Operations Research*. Authors should submit a cover letter and a manuscript via the journal submission site. When requested to select an article type, please select “SING7”.
